

five to ten milliampères are passing, gives a decided shock, and with twenty milliampères or upwards the shock might be serious.

Diets and sick-room cookery are dealt with and a number of useful recipes given.

The last chapter deals with "Nursing as a Profession," or more accurately, with the various openings for training and post-graduate work, as the organization of the profession is not touched upon. In connection with midwifery, we read that "many training-schools give certificates . . . in addition to preparing the candidate for the Central Midwives Board examination, which is the best diploma." It should be stated that it is a penal offence to practise midwifery without holding the certificate of the Central Midwives Board in England and Wales, or of the Board for Scotland in that country.

Also, Malta fever should be attributed to drinking *infected* goats' milk, and the definition of a heinia on page 424 is not strictly accurate; but these are minor blemishes in a most useful book, upon which a great amount of care has been expended.
