The purity of acetyl-salicylic acid is of importance if its dissolution is required to be deferred until the drug reaches the alkaline intestinal juice. We found neither free salicylic nor acetic acid in this preparation. tablet disintegrates satisfactorily in water, and gives absolutely no violet colouration with ferric chloride. On adding 0.2 per cent. hydrochloric acid, representing the acidity of the gastric juice, there is still no response to the iron test, slight hydrolysis only taking place after several The claim is substantiated that this preparation is a particularly pure specimen of acetyl-salicylic acid.

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
