RESIGNATIONS.

Miss Gertrude Cowlin has resigned, owing to illhealth, the position of Assistant Director of the Nursing Division of the League of Red Cross Societies, the Head Office of which is at Geneva, to which she was appointed last February.

The position has been filled by the appointment of Miss Waters, an American trained nurse, so that the offices of both Director (Miss Fitzgerald) and Assistant Director to this service are now filled by trained nurses from the United States.

CHARGE PAY IN MILITARY HOSPITALS.

Charge Pay to Matrons and Sisters-in-Charge of Military Hospitals will be issued with effect from October 1st on the following scale: 100-199 beds, $\pounds 30$ a year; 200-299 beds, $\pounds 40$ a year; and 300 beds and over, $\pounds 45$ a year. The special rates granted in October, 1915, to Matrons and Sisters-in-Charge of Hospitals with 600 beds will now cease.

THE CHARTERED SOCIETY OF MASSAGE AND MEDICAL GYMNASTICS.

In our advertisement columns on page viii will be found the regulations for registered membership of the Chartered Society of Massage and Medical Gymnastics, the name, it will be remembered, taken by the Incorporated Society of Trained Masseuses after its incorporation by Royal Charter on June 9th of the present year.
