To act and think for herself is the right every Nurse should claim, and above all the talk of Associations, schemes, should chain, and above all the tark of Associations, schemes, unions, &c., let her never forget her individual liberty, for it is to the individual, appeals must now be made. To speak of unity serves only to bring about discord, so for a time each Nurse must be happy if she can act for herself. When she can act with others she will be stronger, and when she
