And there can be little doubt that a few days now and then at Brighton would enable many, who now perforce go on until they break down, to pass through their training without detriment to their health. On the other hand, I would point out that Sisters who would like to spend their "Saturdays to Mondays" at the sea, by giving a few days' notice to the Matron, 12, Sussex Square, Brighton, could probably obtain admission at the Home.—Yours faithfully,
