EDITORIAL.

WE have received many kindnesses and many courtesies from Hospital Secretaries. As a class, we have almost invariably found these gentlemen ready to give, immediately, any information which we required, and desirous to afford us every assistance and attention in their power. It has, therefore, been our good fortune to meet with incivility from Hospital officials only on the rarest possible occasions, and we believe that we may say that our experience is that of most journalists. But we would venture to point out that it is extremely important for any public Charity that its officials should feign, if they do not naturally possess, the virtue of courtesy in dealing with members of the Press, and that even the most powerful Institution is none the worse for securing the good commendation of the Fourth Estate of the Realm. We go one step further, and contend that Committees should be most careful in their selection of Secretaries, because an imprudent official might easily bring the gravest discredit upon the best Institution. We should regard it, therefore, as a kindness to any Committee to report any rudeness exhibited by one of their servants. On the other hand, we keenly resent any attempted insolence to this Journal as an insult offered to the Press of which we form part, and the dignity of which we are as jealous to maintain, as we have ever striven to assert its right to most unfettered freedom. We therefore bring to the notice of the Committees of St. Mary's Hospital and of Queen Charlotte's Hospital, and of our brother journalists, the strange behaviour
