WE have just received the November number of *The Nurses' Journal*, the official organ of the Royal British Nurses' Association. As our readers are probably aware, our contemporary appears quarterly, so that the present is the last number for this year, and concludes the first volume.

We have watched its progress with the greatest interest and pleasure, and can most warmly and heartily congratulate the Association upon the success of its journal. We know so well the pitfalls and the difficulties of journalism that we may confess that we, at first, believed that the Association would have done more wisely to have adopted some existing paper as its organ rather than institute an altogether new periodical. And so, half fearing that the task would prove too much for its strength, we have hesitated to give more than an occasional notice of the contents of each successive number. We were, until quite recently, uninformed as to the manner in which the editorial and business departments were conducted or we should have felt no doubts upon the matter. We now understand that a small Journal Committee was appointed, consisting of several of the best-known Members of the Association, and including one gentleman who is well known in the journalistic world as a prominent member of the staff of *The Times* newspaper.
