

even if exposed to the atmosphere, will keep quite warm for about six hours; or in a less severe test—say, for bed use—we have found it to be quite comfortably warm at the end of twenty hours. "The Comfortable" has a carpet covering, with a loose flap, under which the feet can be placed to avoid the draught. They range in price from eight shillings and sixpence to forty-five shillings, according to size and the materials used in manufacture; but all are equally well finished off. We certainly recommend their use, and would suggest that the directions as to first filling are fully carried out. We understand that they can be obtained of all leading ironmongers; but if they are not found in stock, we should recommend our readers to write to the manufacturers for the name of their nearest agent.

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—We have received from Messrs. W. Hill and Son, 60, Bishopsgate Street, E.C., samples of these manufactures, which they are now introducing to the public. It is well known that infants cannot digest pure starch, which, unfortunately, is the basis of our farinaceous foods.
