patients. Their personal linen is not washed at the Hospital. The Staff consisting of House Surgeon, Matron, eight Nurses, and ten servants, there are about eighty Ward sheets, fourteen quilts, fourteen blankets, eighty pillow-cases, towels, &c., beside the house linen, eighty Nurses' and servants' aprons, and, of course, a large number of collars and cuffs to be washed each week. The servants all wear cotton dresses, but not the Nurses. The washing is not to be done by machinery." I heartily congratulate this lady upon her success, this being the second time Mrs. Taylor has obtained the prize, consisting of a guinea's worth of books.
