in such form as shall from time to time be prescribed by Regulations of the Council approved by the Minister of Health."

LIST OF TRAINING SCHOOLS TO BE KEPT.

It is prescribed that "the Council shall keep a List of the Complete Training Schools, of the Affiliated or Combined Training Schools, and of the other Training Schools from time to time approved by the Council for the training of Nurses who are applicants for admission to the General Part, or any Supplementary Part, of the Register as the case may be.".

Admission to the General Part of the Register.

For admission to the General Part of the Register it is required that every applicant "shall be a female" who has "completed a course of three years' training in a complete training school, or, in the alternative, of four years' training in two, or more, of the Combined or Affiliated Schools on the Council's list of Training Schools for Registered Nurses."

For admission of Nurses (other than Sick Children's Nurses), who are registered on a Supplementary Part of the Register, two years' training only in a Complete Training School for Registered Nurses will be necessary. A Registered Sick Children's Nurse will be required to furnish evidence of two years' training in a Complete School for Registered Nurses, or of one year's training in a hospital for Men only, and one year's training in a hospital for Women only, on the List of Combined or Affiliated Schools for Registered Nurses.

Admission to the Supplementary Parts of the Register.

Applicants for admission to the Supplementary Parts of the Register for Male Nurses, for Mental Nurses, and for Nurses of Mental Defectives, must furnish evidence on similar lines, in relation to training received in Schools for these special branches.

It is provided, in the case of an application for admission to the Supplementary Part of the Register for Sick Children's Nurses, that "a Nurse registered on the General, or a Supplementary Part of the Register, shall only be required to furnish evidence that, subsequently to her Registration, she has completed a course of one year's training in a School on the Council's List of Training Schools for Sick Children's Nurses."

"In the case of an application for admission to the Supplementary Part of the Register for Fever Nurses, every applicant must furnish evidence that she has completed a course of two years' training in a School on the Council's List of Training Schools for Fever Nurses, provided always that a Nurse registered on the General or a Supplementary Part of the Register shall only be required to furnish evidence that she has, subsequently to her Registration, completed a course of one year's training in a School on the Council's list of Training Schools for Fever Nurses." Admission to the Register between ist July, 1923, and the 1st July, 1925.

In regard to admission to the Register between 1st July, 1923, and 1st July, 1925, it is provided that :---

(I) "An Existing Nurse or an Intermediate Nurse whose name is already on the Register and who desires to be admitted to another part of the Register before the 1st July, 1925, shall be admitted thereto, upon her furnishing the same evidence as would have to be furnished in the case of a similar application after the 1st July, 1925.

(2) "A Nurse whose name is already on a Supplementary Part of the Register and who desires to be admitted to the General Part of the Register before the 1st July, 1925, shall be admitted thereto upon her furnishing the same evidence as would have to be furnished in the case of a similar application after the 1st July, 1925."

Re Alteration of Preface to Examination Syllabus.

Recommendation 7.

"That the following letter be forwarded to the Minister of Health :--

" Dear Sir,

SYLLABUS OF SUBJECTS FOR EXAMINATION.

"We find that the last paragraph of the Preface has been the subject of some misunderstanding. It has always been understood that there would be one Optional Examination in 1924, and that no nurse would be admitted to it who had not completed her training before the Examination takes place.

the Examination takes place. "We desire your permission to alter the Preface to the Syllabus as follows :—

"Those nurses who will have completed their training after June 30th, 1924, and before July 1st, 1925, will be eligible for registration as Intermediate Nurses without sitting for the State Examination, but should they wish to register by Examination, they will have to pass both the Preliminary and Final State Examinations on the same footing as Future Nurses.
