It was also decided to arrange for the Annual Dinner, if possible, on the evening of the same day, to which distinguished guests should be invited.

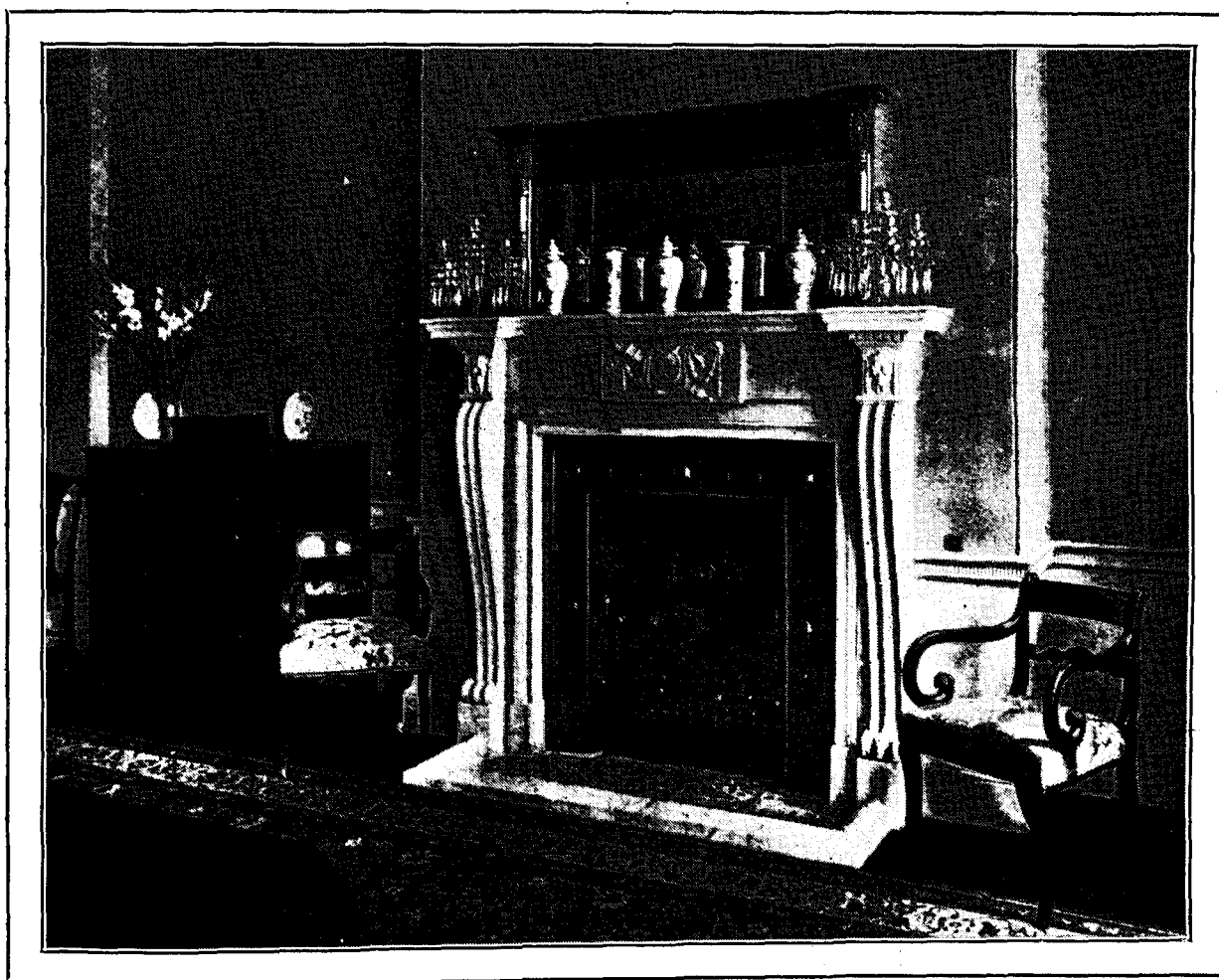
Vote of Thanks to Donor.
