From Miss Beatrice Cutler: A Union Jack Flag and an armorial china dish.

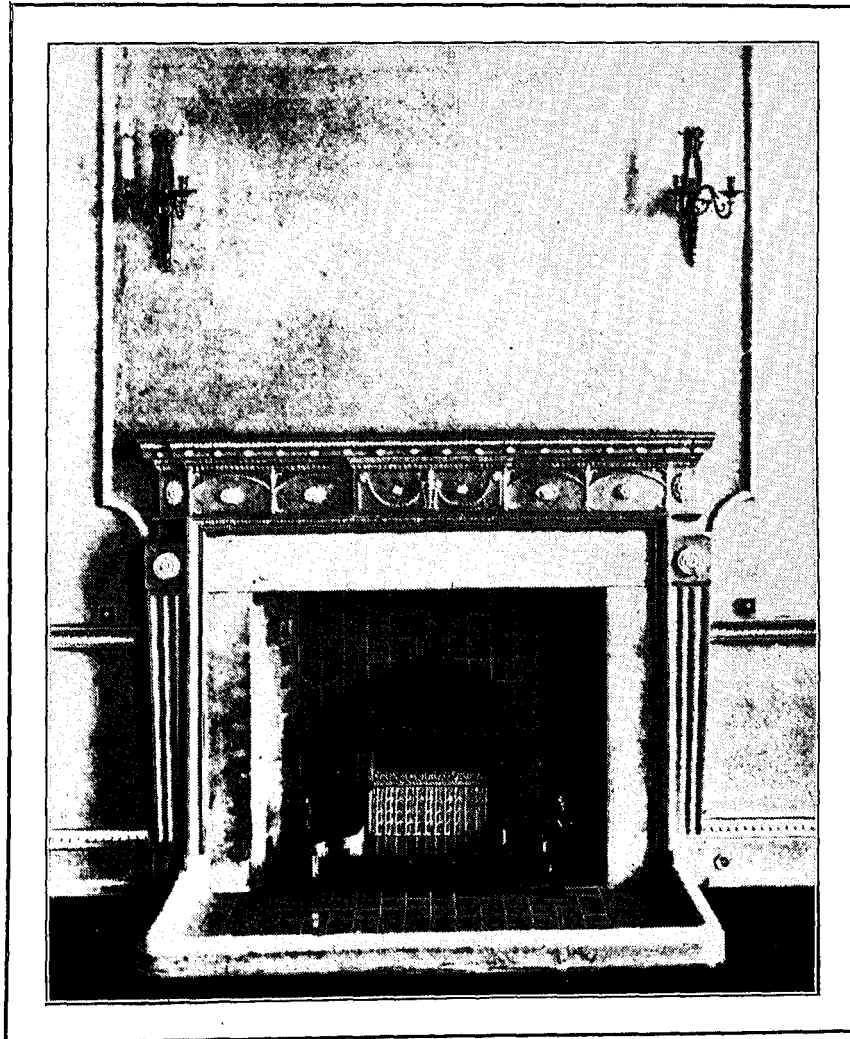
From Miss M. Ellis Rowell: 12 silver teaspoons.
