#### Recognition of Skill of Craftsmen who decorated Headquarters.

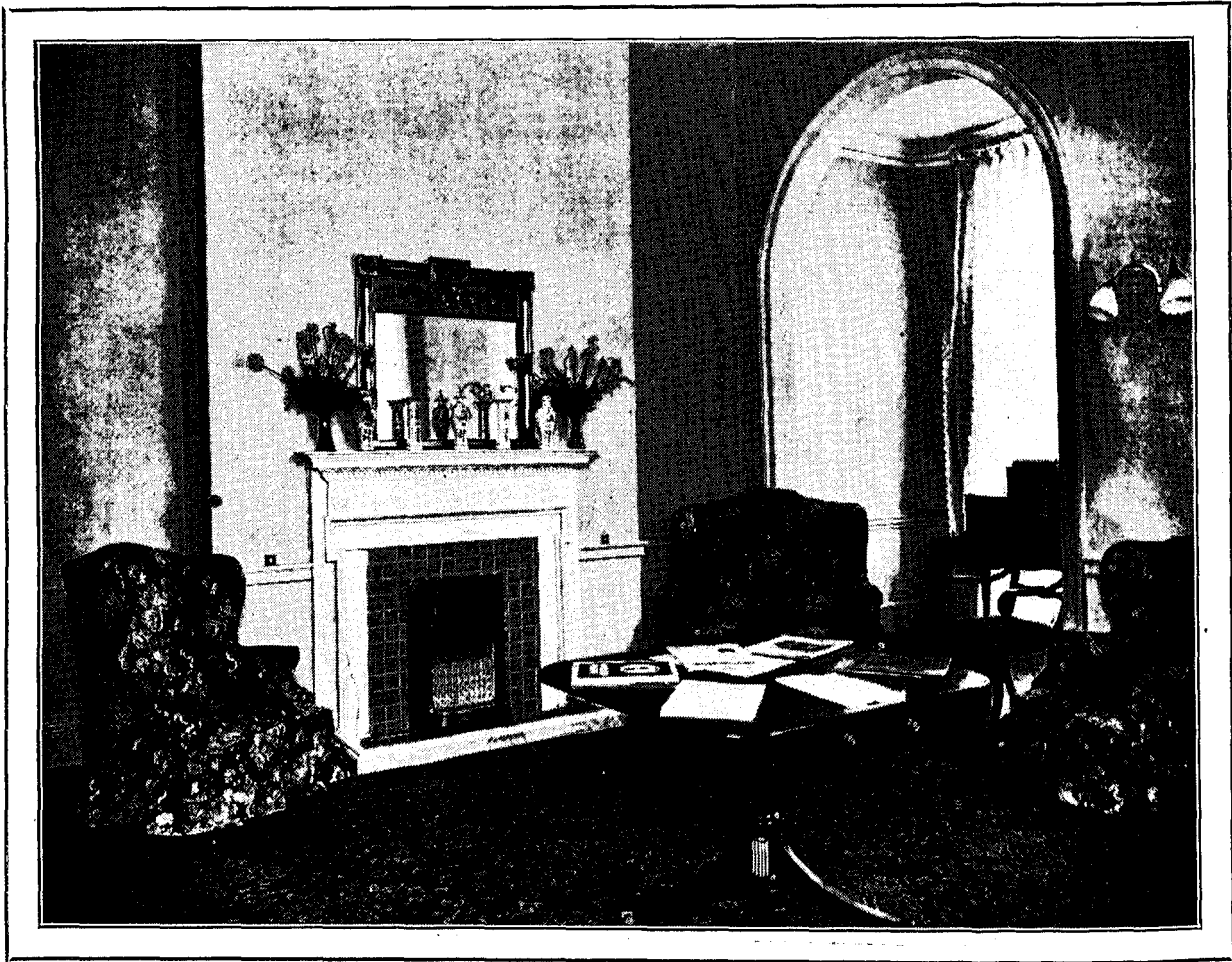
