"That the nurse registries should be organised and directed only by nurses and not be a commercial pro-position."

RESOLUTION PASSED BY THE ROUND TABLE ON "PRIN-CIPLES AND ADAPTATIONS IN PIONEER NURSING ":

"That the International Council of Nurses consider the possibility of preparing a general text-book on practical nursing for use in countries or groups of countries where nursing is in a pioneer stage, and where no such text-books exist.'

(This Resolution has been referred by the Board of Directors of the International Council of Nurses to its Education Committee).

RESOLUTION PASSED BY THE ROUND TABLE ON "THE NURSING PROFESSION IN RELATION TO MENTAL HYGIENE ": "That the Board

of Directors of the InternationalCouncil of Nurses be asked to appoint a Standing Commit-tee on Mental Nursing and Hygiene."

(The Board of Directors has acted upon this resolution and decided that such a committee shall be appointed).
