# A CHURCH IN THE ROCKIES.

## CANADA'S MEMORIAL TO EDITH CAVELL.

A memorial Church to Edith Cavellis to be built in Jasper Park in the heart of the Canadian Rockies. It will stand on the shore of Lac Beauvert facing the snow-capped mountain which bears her name, and in design will follow Norwich Cathedral where the martyred nurse worshipped as a child, and in whose shadow she is buried. The church will be so orientated that the Glacier of the Angels, which lies on the mountain's slope, will be framed by the altar window. The main doorway will incorporate the Red Cross of Geneva.

A remarkable feature will be the provision of separate vestries for different denominations in Canada by means of which they will be able to keep in their own control everything that is required for their respective forms of service. This plan has already been endorsed by the Roman Catholic Church in Canada as well as by other denominations.

The church will cost about fir,000 and the money is being subscribed voluntarily by visitors to the Park from practically every nation. Among the warm supporters of

the project is President Coolidge of the United States. The proposal to build the church has grown out of the custom of holding annual memorial services cn August 4th at the base of Mount Edith Cavell.

The Lord Mayor of Norwich, says TheTimes, much interested in the announcement that a memorial church to Edith Cavell is to be built in Jasper Park, in the heart of the Canadian Rockies, has suggested that a gift of a piece of Norman architecture from Cathedral Norwich

might be utilised as a foundation-stone for the new church. On being approached on the subject by the Lord Mayor, the Dean of Norwich said : "I shall esteem it a real privilege to join forces with you to the fullest measure of my power, and as a tangible expression of my warm co-operation I am making a selection from our Cathedral museum of one or two ancient stones which bear indisputable evidence of Norman craftsmanship of the last decade of the eleventh century. I can offer no more suitable contribution to the Edith Cavell Memorial than these stones, which for so many generations formed part of the fabric of the cathedral under whose shadow rest the mortal remains of the saintly woman we all join in holding in such high regard."
