On the recommendation of the Committee the names on a List of Applications for Examinerships (not disclosed) were added to the Panel of Examiners.
The Committee also reported that they had considered the Board of Examiners for the Preliminary State Examination and that the Hon. Gertrude Best, S.R.N., A.R.R.C., had been invited to serve for a further year.
They also reported that they had considered the Report of the Conference with representatives of the British Hospitals Association, the Board of Control and the Association of Poor Law Unions on the draft scheme of Inspection of Training Schools.
It was agreed (r) to go into Committee (subsequently changed to in camera) on the Report of the Conference, and (2) That the draft scheme of Inspection of Training Schools be forwarded to the Minister of Health for his observation and approval.

## Finance.

On the recommendation of the Finance-Committee the Bills and Claims submitted for payment were approved, and the sum of $£ 25$ for Insurance Stamps, $£$ xo for Petty Cash, and $£ 5,300$ for Examiners' Claims and Expenses in connection with the May 1928 Examinations were allowed.
The Committee raised no objection to Recommendations

9 and ro of the General Purposes Committee, which were (9) That six quarto steel-filing cabinets for Registry at $f_{6} 6$ 3. 6 d . each be purchased, and in connection with the decoration of the Council's Offices, which have been in occupation for over three years, that of three tenders for the above work that of Messrs. Colley \& Sons, Ltd., amounting to $f^{2} 69$ be accepted, and these Recommendations were agreed.

The Committee also reported that in accordance with authority granted at Council Meeting on May r8th, 1928, the sum of $£^{2,000}$ has been invested in New Zealand $4 \frac{1}{2}$ per cent. (New) Stock costing $£ \mathrm{I}, 90 \mathrm{I} 5 \mathrm{~s}$. od.

## The Revenue Account and Balance Sheet:

Dr. Fawcett, Chairman of the Finance Committee, presented the Revenue Account and Balance Sheet as submitted by the Auditor for the year ended March 3rst, r928, and also a Financial Statement, as Chairman of the Finance Committee, elucidating some of the items in this Account and Balance Sheet, together with the Recommendation of the Finance Committee " that the Revenue Account and Balance Sheet as submitted be adopted."

## Financial Statement. <br> By Chairman of Finance Committee.

Considered-The Revenue Account and Balance Sheet submitted by the Auditor for the year ended March 31st, 1928.

The expenditure of the Council is now fairly stabilised under the various headings seen on the Revenue Account, and reached a sum of $£ 32,471$ for the past year, a net increase of $£ 3,123$.

This expansion is accounted for chiefly by-
(1) a rise in cost of salaries on the annual increment scale and for extra temporary help during the Election and £300 to cover payments for Health Insurance
(2) an increase of $£ 1,894$ for remuneration of Examiners, and to cover cost of more examinees, and the additional charges involved.
(3) some increase for postage, fuel and light, examination expenses, domestic wages and claims for travelling expenses of Members of the Council
On the other hand, there was a decrease under some heads amounting to $£ 1,371$, arising in-
(1) Printing of Registers, $£ 761$.
(2) Repairs, $£ 512$.

On this side of the account there was an additional expense of $£ 1,024$ for the Quinquennial Election.

On the reccipts side of the Revenue Account the total is $£ 35,8446 \mathrm{~s}$. 4 d ., leaving a balance of $£ 3,737$ 2s., less depreciation and structural repairs, $£ 3645 \mathrm{~s}$. 1d., leaving $£ 3,372$ 16s. 11d., which with $E 1,722$ 14s. 2d. from interest on investments and from the Bankers equals $£ 5,09511 \mathrm{~s}$. 1 d . in all.

Receipts for Examination Fees, $£ 27,721$ 9s. 8d., show an increase of $£ 1,432$, but this does not compensate for the added
