concerning them, such as programmes, invitation cards, badges, reports, etc.

Congressists are requested to leave their cards with their addresses at the Secretariat of the Conference in order to enable the Secretariat to send them reports of the Conference.

They are requested likewise to enter upon a form which will be given to them at the Secretariat of the Conference the address to which they may wish their correspondence to be forwarded to them after the close of the Conference.

Information Office at the Rome Railway Station.

From the 20th to the 25th September nurses arriving

at the station in Rome must present to the uniformed nurses their lodging card.

Inauguration Session.

The solemn inauguration session will take place in the Capitol (uniform).

Immediately after the inauguration session, there will be held the reception given by the Governor of Rome in the Palace of the Capitol.

Sessions of the Conference.

The sessions for discussion by the Conference will take place on the first floor of the Palace of the Exhibition, Via Nazionale, and there likewise will be held the meetings of the Executive Committee, the Council of Management and the General Meeting of the Union.

The speech of the Hon. Professor Eugene Morelli will be delivered in the "Great Hall" of the Collegio Romano (Piazza del Collegio Romano). Congressists desiring to be present have only to show their travelling booklet.

Cinematography.

During the sessions of the Conference, in a separate hall will be projected films relating to the fight against Tuberculosis in different countries. Entrance into the hall

will be free for Congressists and the members of their families.

Visits to Museums and Excursions.

By a special concession of His Excellency the Minister of Public Instruction, Congressists during the days of the Conference will be able, on presenting their travelling booklet, which serves as an identity card, to visit, free of charge, the Museums of Rome, Ostia, Tarquinia and Tivoli.

Wives of Congressists may, as they wish, participate in excursions after coming to an understanding with the Ladies' Committee and the representative of the C.I.T., which will be sitting at the Secretariat of the Conference.

. Visits to the Anti-Tuberculous Institutions in Rome.

As indicated in the General Programme, visits to the Anti-Tuberculous Institutions in Rome will take place during the period of the Conference. The detailed programme will be issued daily at the Headquarters of the Conference. Congressists are requested to register in advance at the Secretariat the visits in which they desire to take part.

Excursion to Anzio (28th September).

Congressists desirous of taking part in the excursion to

Anzio are requested to register beforehand with the Secretariat of the Conference.

Day in Milan (29th September).

Congressists wishing to take part in the Day in Milan are requested to register their names at the Secretariat of the Conference, where they will be told the exact time of the departure of the train from Rome. In order to do the journey from Rome to Milan at a reduced price, Congressists may make use of one of the coupons of their booklet.

Visit to the Sanatoria of Valtellina, the Upper Adige and the Trentino (from 30th September to 6th October).

Only those Congressists will be admitted who have previously registered, and they are limited to three hundred in number. Congressists should obtain their registration card from the Secretariat of the Conference. A payment of 350 lire confers the right of performing this journey, extra expense, without from the time of leaving Milan (morning of the 30th September) until the return (afternoon of October). The to Milan 6th October). the

stay in Milan (from the 29th to the 30th September) must be paid for by Congressists themselves. The offices of the C.I.T. (N. 16, Via-S. Margherita, Milan) will be happy to give all informa-

Via-S. Margherita, Milan) will be happy to give all information desired as regards the stay in Milan.

The visit to the Sanatoria will take place in accordance with the itinerary indicated in the Programme of the Sixth Conference. As this visit entails the reaching of a rather high altitude in the mountains, we advise Congressists to provide themselves with the necessary clothing and to reduce to a minimum the quantity of baggage they take with them. Evening dress is not obligatory for the receptions. The approximate cost for the seven days will be between £3 and £4.
