THE ORGANIZATION OF THE INTERNATIONAL COUNCIL OF NURSES.

For the information of those not well acquainted with the organization of the International Council of Nurses

we give the following details.

The International Council of Nurses is a Federation of Associations of Trained Nurses united to improve their work in the service of the sick, to promote the health of the nations, and to secure the honour and the interests of the Nursing Profession.

Objects.

The International Council of Nurses stands for selfgovernment by nurses in their associations, with the aim of raising ever higher the standard of education, profes-

sional ethics, and public usefulness of their members. The International Council of Nurses stands for that full development of the human being and citizen in every nurse, which shall best enable her to bring her professional knowledge and skill to the many-sided service that modern society demands of her.

The Council aims to provide a means of communication between various nationalities, to provide opportunities for them to confer upon questions relating to the welfare of their patients and their profession and to afford facilities for the interchange of international hospitality.

Membership.

There are two classes of members, active and honorary. Active Members. One National Association from each country, composed of trained nurses or representative societies of nurses, may become an active member of the Council, providing its Constitution and By-laws are in harmony with those of the International Council.

Honorary membership may be conferred by unanimous vote of the Grand Council upon ex-Presidents of the International Council or upon nurses who have rendered valuable assistance to the Nursing Profession.

The Presidents of National Organisations of nurses which are Active Members of the International Council of Nurses

are known as National Representatives.

Associate National Representatives are Nurses in countries where a National Association has not been organized, or where an organization exists which is not a member of the Council, who are appointed by the Board of Directors to

act in an advisory capacity to the Council.

The Governing Body of the International Council of Nurses is known as the Grand Council, and is composed of the Board of Directors with four accredited delegates

from each Active Member.

The Board of Directors is composed of the Hon. Presidents, the President, First and Second Vice-Presidents, the Treasurer and the Secretary of the International Council of Nurses and the Presidents of National Associations of Nurses affiliated to the Council.

International Congresses of Nurses.

The International Council of Nurses is authorized to hold quadrennial Congresses at such place and such time as may be determined upon at the previous meeting of the Grand Council. Such Congresses are not an integral part of the work of the International Council, and the Grand Council may, and has, met for the transaction of business without convening a Congress, as in Copenhagen in 1922. It is, however, a usual and very delightful practice of the International Council to convene a Congress at the same time as the Meeting of the Grand Council.

Interim Conferences on Nursing may be convened by the

Board of Directors.
