## REPORT OF THE COUNCIL MEETING.

The thirty-third Meeting of the Council of the British College of Nurses was held at 39, Portland Place, London, W.1, on Saturday, May 25th, at 2 p.m. The President, Mrs. Bedford Fenwick, was in the Chair, and the following Members were present:—Miss M. Breay and Miss S. A. Villiers, Vice Presidents; Miss M. G. Allbutt, Mrs. Lancelot Andrews, Miss A. M. Bushby, Miss M. S. Cochrane, R.R.C., Miss D. K. Graham, Miss I. Mac-

donald, Fellows; and Miss E. J. Haswell and Miss K. M. Latham, R.R.C., Members.

Prayers having been read by the Secretary, the Minutes of the last Meeting were confirmed.

## Correspondence.

Letters were received and considered:

- 1. Letter from the Secretary of State for Home Affairs acknowledging the receipt of the letter sent to him on May 9th containing further evidence of the treatment of a victim of Encephalitis Lethargica, sentenced by the Kingston County Bench to one month's hard labour without any enquiry whatever into his physical condition.
- 2. Letter from a Member relative to a Benevolent Grant. A grant of £5 has been sent to her.

3. Letter from a Fellow thanking the Council for help and advice.

4. Letter from Mr. John Whieldon (Major Sir Richard Barnett's cousin) thanking the President and Council for letter of sympathy to him in his illness, and for the gift of flowers sent, which he greatly appreciated.
