THE RADIUM FUND.

A charter for the constitution of trustees to administer the National Radium Fund and to provide for the duties of the National Radium Commission, has been granted

by the Privy Council.

The draft provides that the occupants for the time being of the offices of President of the Royal College of Physicians of London, President of the Royal College of Surgeons of England, President of the Royal Society of Medicine, Chairman of the British Medical Association, President of the Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh, President of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh, President of the Royal Faculty of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow, and Regius Professor of Medicine at Oxford and Cambridge shall choose a panel of not fewer than twelve persons having special knowledge of the use of radium in medicine, from which twelve persons six will be selected by the trustees to form part of the executive body, or Commission. The executive will comprise also a chairman and one member each appointed by the Ministry of Health, the Secretary of State for Scotland, the Medical Research Council, and the Department of Scientific and Industrial Research.

GENERAL NURSING COUNCIL FOR ENGLAND AND WALES.

Registration.

Correspondence, Interviews and Permits.
