THE INTERNATIONAL COUNCIL OF NURSES. THE MONTREAL CONGRESS.

The preliminary Programme of the International Congress of Nurses, convened by the International Council of Nurses to meet at Montreal July 8th-13th next, on the invitation of the Canadian Nurses Association, has now been issued, and will be found in the following columns.

Messrs. It can be obtained from the Hon. Secretary, National Council of Nurses of Great Britain, 39, Portland Place, London, W. A halfpenny stamp for postage should be enclosed.

Miss Mabel K. Holt, Lady Superintendent of the Montrea¹ General Hospital, whose charming portrait we published

in our February issue; is Convenor of the Committee on Entertainment, and information as to the social side of the Congress will be issued later.

We have much pleasure in announcing that the first invitation offered is one to the Board of Directors and the Official Delegates composing the Grand Council of the International Council of Nurses.

Miss Holt has planned for a special train to take them to Ottawa, the capital of Canada, and the seat of Government, on July 3rd. There they will be the guests at luncheon of the Nurses of Ottawa, and, in the afternoon of that day, they will have the honour of being entertained at Government House

by their Excellencies Viscount Willingdon (the Governor-General of Canada) and Viscountess Willingdon.

Viscount Willingdon, who has had a distinguished career has been Governor-General of Canada since 1926, and has also been Governor of Bombay and of Madras. Viscountess Willingdon is a daughter of the first Lord Brassey, to whom Viscount Willingdon, then Mr. Freeman Thomas, was A.D.C. when Lord Brassey was Governor of Victoria.

The Meeting of the Board of Directors was convened for July 3rd, so in order to accept the invitation of the Governor-General and Lady Willingdon it has been decided that the first meeting of the Board of Directors shall be convened for Tuesday, July 2nd at 9 a.m., and that its meetings shall be suspended on July 3rd, and resumed and continued from July 4th-7th.

The Meetings of the Grand Council are convened for July 5th-7th.

It will be realised, therefore, that it will be necessary

for the Hon. Officers of the International Council of Nurses, the Presidents of National Councils, and the Official Delegates who are travelling to Montreal from Europe, to leave a week earlier than the main party who are travelling by the Alaunia to attend the International Congress of Nurses, but not the business meetings of the I.C.N. For this purpose the Ascania, a sister-boat to the Alaunia, also of the Cunard Line, will probably be found to be the most convenient boat.


