I should be glad to know whether the Council would care to have any social gathering to give them opportunity to

meet Fellows and Members.

The President added that the visit to Canterbury had been immensely enjoyed, the gracious welcome of the Vice-Dean; the knowledge of Miss Babington, who simply made the building and history of the marvellous edifice alive with romance, was a rare treat indeed and most educational.

The Council passed votes of thanks to Canon Gardiner, Miss Babington, and the kind hostesses who provided

the excellent luncheon en route.

It was agreed to entertain Miss Meyboom and the party of Dutch matrons and nurses to tea at the College on April 11th, and to invite Fellows and Members to welcome them.

The arrangements for "London Week," during which six of the senior Fellows and Members from a distance would be entertained as guests, were referred to the Social Schemes Section. It was suggested that it might be well to include the annual meeting when the visitors would come into touch with many of their colleagues.

The Report was approved.

THE UNVEILING OF MRS. PANKHURST'S STATUE.

The President reported that the College had been invited to attend the Unveiling Ceremony of Mrs. Pankhurst's Statue in the Victoria Tower Gardens by the Rt. Hon. Stanley Baldwin, M.P., on March 6th, and four purple tickets had been sent by the Memorial Committee.

She herself had attended as President of the National Council of Nurses of Great Britain, and Miss Bushby, Miss Cochrane, Miss Allbutt and Miss Hale attended for the College. The former placed a beautiful chaplet of spring flowers and palms at the foot of the statue, "With Homage." The ceremony, which was very impressive, was attended by 10,000 people. Sister Pine, who was present, wore the thirteen dated silver bars awarded her for devoted care of Mrs. Pankhurst when released from prison upon thirteen occasions. This historic Badge Sister Pine intends to leave to the History of Nursing Section of the British College of Nurses, and it will, in the future, be recognised as an "heirloom" of unique and imperishable value.

Two photographs, kindly given by Mrs. Marshall, one of the Statue and one of the Ceremony, including the representatives of the College, were on view, and will be presented to the History of Nursing Section.
