T.A.N.S. BENEVOLENT FUND.

Cottages at Rickmansworth for ex-members of the Territorial Army Nursing Service.

CONDITIONS OF TENANCY.

We are asked to state that a vacancy will shortly occur for a retired member of the Territorial Army Nursing Service to have a furnished cottage at Rickmansworth.

The Cottages are fully furnished and are rent free. Rates and taxes are paid and the upkeep of the cottages is maintained.

The tenant is responsible for fuel, light and her own maintenance and for keeping the garden in order. She must have small private means or be in receipt of a pension, and must provide herself with a companion (not necessarily a nurse) approved by the Committee, who will live with her and share expenses. It is considered that their joint income should amount to at least f_2 per week.

So many nurses cannot afford a home of their own in their old age, and yet it is, for most of them, a haven of rest much to be desired. Therefore the furnished cottages at Rickmansworth provided by the T.A.N.S. Benevolent Fund are a welcome boon.
