Editorial.

THE LONDON HOSPITAL.

ONCE more, we are compelled to revert to the London Hospital, and once more, unhappily, we can only express our regret at the state of affairs in the Nursing Department of that great Institution. In another column, our readers will find a brief account of the proceedings at the Court of Governors, which was held last week, as the pressure upon our space prevents us from giving a *verbatim* report of the speeches made on this occasion. We are amused to observe the extreme earnestness with which the authorities of the Hospital declared that they are not afraid of *The Nursing Record*, and can only remind them of the well-worn proverb, *qui s'excuse s'accuse*. We do not wish these gentlemen to be afraid of this Journal. Indeed, it is only their consciences which could make them so, because we have spoken nothing but the truth in our comments upon their proceedings. If they were wise—which they have conclusively proved they are not—they would, however, refrain from small and essentially silly sneers at the opinions expressed by the Press. Experience should have made them more cautious. Eighteen months ago, we took up this matter, and they attempted to ignore us. We found that most of our contemporaries had been completely misled and misinformed; and that they were consequently disinclined to take up the question. But we pointed out scandal after
