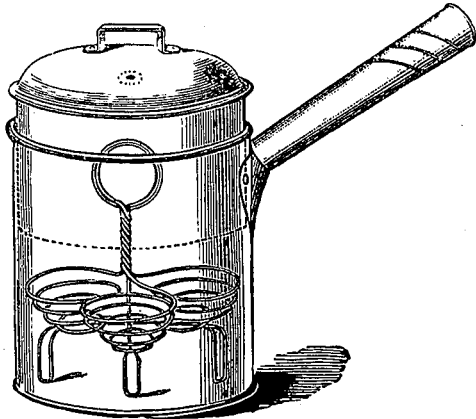


SIGNAL EGG SAUCEPAN (Messrs. H. G. Planner, and Co., 1, Arthur Street East, London Bridge, E.C.).—This consists of a serviceable four-inch-wide tin pan, containing a loose iron frame or holder (to hold three eggs). The eggs are placed



in the frame, then put into the saucepan, and just covered over with cold water. The lid is placed on the pan, and when the eggs are done, a whistle, fixed in the lid, emits a sharp sound. With this useful and ingenious contrivance, a badly-boiled egg is an impossibility. For even

if the servant happens to be reading a harrowing tale of love and mystery whilst the eggs are boiling, the whistle brings her back at once to mundane affairs and well-cooked eggs. It is the most charming and satisfactory little arrangement that we have ever seen, and as the price is only one shilling (post-free, one shilling and threepence), they should sell in thousands.
