THE NIGHTINGALE FELLOWSHIP.

Florence Nightingale, O.M. Born May 12th, 1820. Died August 13th, 1910. A Commemoration Service was held in St. Thomas's Hospital Chapel at 10.30 a.m. on Sunday, May 8th.

The Sermon was preached by the Lord Bishop of Southwark.

MEDICAL ADVISORY BOARD FOR BLIND MASSEURS.

The Association of Certificated Blind Masseurs has formed a Medical Advisory Board to advise on the extension of training of blind masseurs and masseuses. The New Board will consist of Dr. L. Danyers Bailey, Dr. C. C. Worster-Drought, Dr. F. D. Howitt, Dr. W. Kerr Russell, Mr. P. Jenner Verrall, Mr. A. Mace (representing St. Dunstan's), and Mr. P. L. GENERAL NURSING COUNCIL FOR ENGLAND AND WALES.

The one hundred and thirty-fourth meeting of the General Nursing Council for England and Wales was held at the offices of the Council, 20, Portland Place, London, W.1, on April 22nd. The Chairman, Miss E. M. Musson, C.B.E., R.R.C., presided.

Finance.

On the recommendation of the Finance Committee, Bills and Claims submitted for payment were approved, and the sum of £150 for Postage Stamps and £20 for Insurance Stamps were allowed.

Registration.

The Registration Committee reported that the numbers of successful candidates at the February Examinations were: General Part of the Register, 1,082; Supplementary Part of the Register for Male Nurses, 4; Mental Nurses, 23; Sick Children's Nurses, 51; Fever Nurses, 132. Total, 1,292.

On the recommendation of the Registration Committee the Council agreed to grant a duplicate Certificate of Registration to a nurse who had reported the loss of her Certificate.

It was agreed to grant duplicate Badges to five nurses who had reported the loss of theirs a year ago.

Applications for approval for Registration on April 22nd were: General Register, by Reciprocity, 10; Supplementary Register for Fever Nurses, by Examination, 7. Total, 17.

It was agreed that 44 nurses who had hitherto failed to pay their Retention Fee, and now wished their names included in the Register, should be re-included.

Education and Examination.

On the recommendation of the Education and Examination Committee it was agreed:—

"That the name of the Italian Hospital be removed from the list of Approved Affiliated Training Schools."

That the cancellation of the schemes of affiliation between (1) City of London Hospital for Diseases of the Heart and Lungs and the General Infirmary, Salisbury, and (2) the Brompton Hospital for Consumption and Diseases of the Chest, and the General Infirmary, Salisbury, be approved.
