Head sister-in-chief £213 15s. a year minimum, to £261 5s. maximum, plus an allowance of £47 10s.; head sister, £213 15s., to £261 5s.; superintending sister, £116 3s. to £174 19s.; and sister, £62 18s. to £106 11s.

THE GENERAL NURSING COUNCIL FOR ENGLAND AND WALES.

The One Hundred and Thirtieth Meeting of the General Nursing Council for England and Wales was held at the Offices of the Council, 20, Portland Place, London, W., on December 18th at 2.30 p.m. The Chairman Miss E. M. Musson, C.B.E., R.R.C., presided.

Finance.

Bills and Claims submitted for payment by the Finance Committee were approved, and £150 allowed for Postage Stamps and £20 for Insurance Stamps.

It was agreed that copies of the Rules of the Council should be issued at a cost of 1s. post free, and the various Syllabuses of Training and Examination at a cost of 6d. post free.

The Committee raised no objection to Recommendations

11 and 12 of the General Purposes Committee.

These were (II): that two 4-drawer oak (mahogany polish) foolscap filing cabinets be purchased at a cost of £6 10s. each, for the Registrar's Department and

(12) that the estimate of Messrs. Edmundsons Electricity Corporation amounting to £7 5s. for renewing flexible cords throughout the Council Offices, refixing switch block and bracket on back stairs and repairing faulty circuit in cellar, be accepted.

It was agreed to include in the Register the names of 26 Nurses who had hitherto failed to pay their Retention Fee, and now wished their names re-included.

Education and Examination.
