The President explained the *raison d'être* of Nightingale Week, organised by the National Council of Nurses, which was to arouse personal interest in the proposed International Memorial to Miss Florence Nightingale by visiting scenes associated with her life, notably a visit of homage to her grave at East Wellow and to Embley Park, intimately associated with her life from her fifth year, the Nightingale School of Nurses at St. Thomas's Hospital and the fine work of the International Students organised by the League of Red Cross Societies in London. She hoped all members of Council eligible would endeavour to take part in the Conference and social functions. The affiliated Associa-

tions had given most generous support to the movement, the programme of which would be, as soon as printed, inserted in the Press.
