In the absence of the Hon. Treasurer, the Hon. Secretary presented the Audited Statement of Accounts and a Report from the Hon. Treasurer for submission to the Grand Council.

It was pointed out that the Auditors' fees had been reduced and that there was a satisfactory balance in hand. Dissatisfaction was expressed with the large sum of money which had to be paid annually to the Headquarters of the I.C.N.

The President reported that all the expenses in connection with the "Nightingale Week" Conference and hospitality for foreign delegates had been met by the very generous donations from members of the Council, and that no expenses whatever were incurred in regard to hospitality.

Miss Dey proposed, Miss Cox-Davies seconded, and it was agreed that the Report and Audited Statement of Accounts be received, and that a message of thanks and appreciation of her work be sent to the Hon. Treasurer.

Section Meeting on "Industrial Nursing." Paris, July 11th. "Methods of Health Work in Industry."

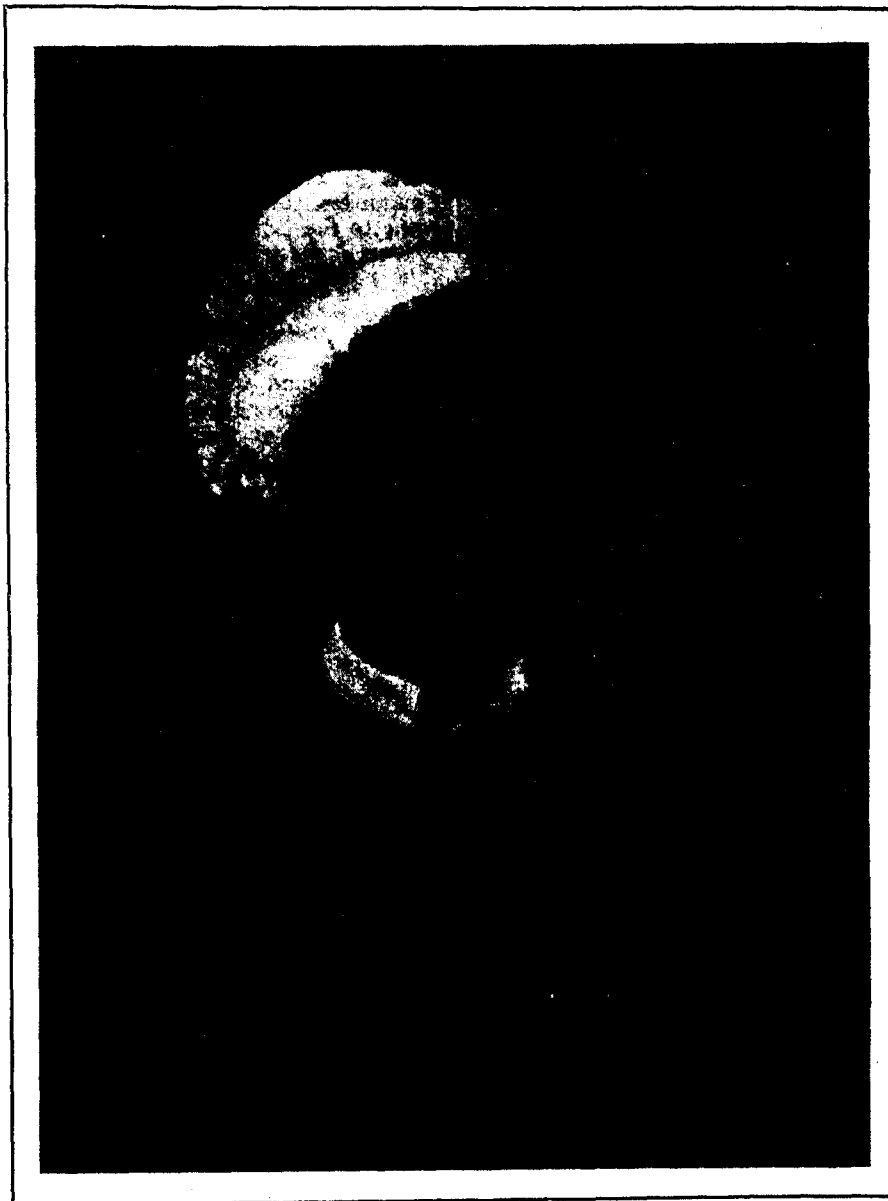
It was agreed to invite Miss M. McEwan, Secretary on the Public Health Section of the College of Nursing to speak on this subject.
