# TRAINED NURSES' ANNUITY FUND GENERAL MEETING.

Her Royal Highness the Princess Arthur of Connaught' R.R.C., S.R.N., presided at the Annual General Meeting of the Trained Nurses' Annuity Fund which was held at 194, Queen's Gate on April 27th. The meeting was well attended.

The Annual Report, in spite of the present serious conditions, ruling in the economic situation, was a very satisfactory one. During the year ended December 31st, 1932, £1,000 had been invested towards the foundation of fresh annuities while the whole expenditure for the year, including expenses for printing and postage, which are always a very heavy item, had amounted to only £147. The amount received in subscriptions was £67 less than in the previous year but this was almost balanced by an increase in the donations received. In moving a vote of thanks to the Princess for taking the Chair, Major Rigg said that he would like on behalf of those present to express their appreciation of the gracious kindness of Her Royal Highness in presiding. He knew that the profession of nursing was very dear to her heart and subscribers to the Fund could not but be encouraged by the interest which she took in it. Major Rigg said that the report of the Fund, as read annually, always seemed to him such a very human document; on the one side it spoke of effort and generosity and on the other, at the Council table, there could be read in the letters that came up, real evidence that such effort and generosity bore rich fruit.

#### CONCERT.

Her Royal Highness Princess Arthur, R.R.C., S.R.N., has graciously consented to be present at a Concert which Miss Bessie Kiek is arranging in support of our Settlement Home for retired Members. The Settlement had a very heavy strain put on its finances when a long garden wall had to be completely re-built and now the outside of the house requires painting and several of the rooms are to be redecorated. A property such as this constantly calls for expenditure if it is to be kept in good repair, and we hope that the Members will show their appreciation of the kindness shown to us by making the concert known among their friends and helping us in every way possible to sell the tickets.
