THE PASSING BELL.

SISTER MISS L. R. WYATT.

We deeply regret having to record the death of Sister Miss L. R. Wyatt, Queen Alexandra's Imperial Military Nursing Service Reserve, on 17th May, 1933, at the Queen Alexandra Military Hospital, Millbank, after a very short illness.

Miss Wyatt received her training at St. Giles' Hospital, Camberwell.

She was appointed as Staff Nurse in the Queen Alexandra's Imperial Military Nursing Service Reserve in February, 1915, and served in England, Egypt and on Hospital Ships till August, 1920, when she was demobilized and returned to work in civil hospitals.

In February, 1921, she was re-enrolled in the Reserve, and in February, 1929, was given a temporary appointment in the Louise Margaret Hospital, Aldershot, where she continued to serve until the date of her fatal illness.

She was a very popular member of the Nursing Staff and beloved by her patients, and her untimely and sudden death is sadly regretted by all.

MISS WINIFREDE MARY SADLER.

It is with deep regret that we have received the news of the death of Miss Winifrede Mary Sadler. Miss Sadler, who was a member of the British College of Nurses, received her general training at Chester Royal Infirmary, and held the Central Midwives Board Certificate. She was appointed to the post of Inspector of Midwives, became a Health Visitor, and after a period of private nursing, Miss Sadler, for some years past and until her death, was a partner in the Chester Nursing Home, Stanley Place, Chester. Sincere sympathy is felt for her friend and partner, Miss J. Parr, in her bereavement.
