### **NURSES'** ORGANISATIONS.

#### MENTAL HOSPITAL MATRONS' ASSOCIATION.

The 40th Quarterly meeting of the Mental Hospital Matrons' Association was held at The Royal British Nurses' Club, 194, Queen's Gate, S.W.7 on Saturday, March 4th,

1933, preceded by a meeting of the Executive Committee. After the minutes of the previous meeting had been confirmed, and letters of regret had been read, the Hon. Secretary, Miss Sewart, said that a letter had been sent to the Association by the Hon. Secretary of the National Council of Nurses, asking the Association to give its support to the Florence Nightingale International Memorial Scholarship. A sub-Committee, consisting of Miss Cuthbert, Miss Hearder, Miss Taylor, Miss Macaulay, Miss Cumming and Miss Jenkins was appointed to enquire into the possibility of providing a sufficient sum to be set aside for the provision of a Scholarship for the use of Mental Nurses.

Miss Richardson had written suggesting the possibility of the forming of a "League of Mental Nurses." The Sub Committee was asked to discuss this question also,

and to submit a report to the next meeting. Miss Vigor, late Matron of the Warneford Hospital, Oxford, and Miss Campbell, Matron, City and County Mental Hospital, Burghill, Hereford, had applied for Membership and were duly elected Members of the Association.

Miss Porter, Bootlam Park, York was elected a member of the Executive Committee in the place of Miss Taylor, who now becomes the Hon. Secretary of the Association.

It was arranged to hold the next meeting on Saturday, June 3rd, 1933 at The Royal British Nurses' Club, 194, Queens Gate, S.W.7.

#### THE LONDON HOSPITAL LEAGUE OF NURSES.

Miss Dorothy Harvey, the Hon. Secretary, writes to inform us that, at its recent meeting on February 4th, it was decided to change the title of the Nurses' League from "The League of London Hospital Nurses" to "The London Hospital League of Nurses," the former title having been criticised as ambiguous. The omission of the prefix "The" before "London

Hospital" in the former title was an inaccuracy, and if that one word had been inserted no exception could have been taken to the name. As it is, as no apostrophy "s" was added to the word Hospital, confusion should not have arisen.
