THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF NURSES OF GREAT BRITAIN.

At the Meeting of the Grand Council of the National Council of Nurses of Great Britain, held on November 22nd, at 39, Portland Place, London, W.1, the following Report of the Florence Nightingale Scholarships Sub-Committee was presented by its Chairman, Miss G. M. Littleboy, Miss M. Breay presented the audited Balance Sheet, and other important business in connection with the International and National Florence Nightingale Memorial Committees, was transacted.

REPORT OF THE FLORENCE NIGHTINGALE SCHOLARSHIPS SUB-COMMITTEE.

Miss G. M. Littleboy read the Report as follows:

I beg to submit the following Report from the Florence Nightingale Scholarships Sub-Committee.

The Sub-Committee which was appointed by the Grand Council at its Annual Meeting on November 23rd, 1932, was composed of the following members : Miss M. G. Allbutt, Miss A. M. Bushby, Miss G. M. Littleboy, Miss E. W. Littlejohn, Miss E. E. P. MacManus and Miss D. M. Smith, together with the three ex-officio Hon. Officers.

Reference,

The reference to the Sub-Committee was as follows :----That an appeal be issued to the affiliated Organisations of Nurses, and the Matrons of hospitals, for the sum of £500, to provide two Scholarships during the interim year 1933-34 in support of the International Courses for Nurses at Bedford College for Women, hitherto financed by the League of Red Cross Societies, and pending the organisation of the proposed Florence Nightingale International Foundation. The Sub-Committee met on December 8th, 1932, on

February 21st and November 3rd, 1933.

At its first Meeting Miss G. M. Littleboy, A.R.R.C, was appointed Chairman.

On December 15th a letter was addressed to the Presidents of all affiliated Organisations, to the Heads of the Naval, Military and Air Force Nursing Services, and the Prison Service, and later the Matrons of the larger hospitals throughout the country were circularised inviting them to bring the appeal before the Nursing Staff, and if they thought fit to invite small subscriptions.

To prevent confusion it was agreed to open a No. 2 Account, National Council of Nurses of Great Britain at the Midland Bank, 431, Oxford Street, W.1.
