That Miss Lucy Ann Hallett, who was awarded a Grant of £2 2s. to take a Course of Lectures at the Tropical Diseases Hospital, Endsleigh Gardens, had passed the Examination, and had written a letter of thanks and appreciation to the Council for the Grant.

GRANTS FOR EDUCATIONAL PURPOSES TO FELLOWS AND MEMBERS.

It was agreed to recommend that the following Grants should be allocated July, 1934-35:-

Two Grants for Midwifery Training and Examination by Central Midwives Board of £35 each.

Three Grants of £10 each towards Hospital Housekeeping

Two Grants of £2 2s. each for Autumn Course of Lectures and Examination on Tropical Diseases at the Tropical Diseases Hospital, Endsleigh Gardens.

It was agreed to recommend that this year, instead of awarding Health Visitors' Grants, arrangements be made for Courses of Training in Venereal Diseases, with a view to paying Grants for this training.

Administration Classes.—That the holding of Administration Classes be continued was recommended, and a varied programme for the Autumn and Spring Courses was considered and approved.

Miss Cochrane reported that she is at present in communication with a hospital concerning the possibility of arranging for a Course of Training in Venereal Diseases, and will report the result in due course.

With these additions, the Report was adopted.
