

(b) the applicants who have not had a course in obstetrics equivalent to the undergraduate course given in Manitoba will be required to take a post-graduate course in obstetrics acceptable to the Board of Manitoba Association of Registered Nurses before registration;

(c) applicants who have not had a course in communicable diseases equivalent to that given to undergraduate nurses in Manitoba, will be required to take a post-graduate course in communicable diseases acceptable to the Board of the Manitoba Association of Registered Nurses before registration. (The training in communicable diseases is at present a requirement for registration in Manitoba, according to the terms of the Act. Should this requirement be deleted from the Act in the future, it would not be necessary to require it from applicants for Reciprocity).'

NOTE.—A General Hospital is defined as one which admits Men, Women, and Children, and gives instruction in the four main Services—Medical, Surgical, Gynæcological, and Children's diseases. Such General training may be given in one General Hospital, recognised as a Complete Training School or in recognised Affiliated or Associated Hospitals which together give instruction in the above-named Services.

#### Education and Examination.

On the recommendation of the Education and Examination Committee, it was agreed that:—

The Caernarvonshire and Anglesey Infirmary, Bangor, be provisionally approved for a period of one year, as a complete training school for nurses;

Newcastle General Hospital be provisionally approved for a period of one year as a complete training school for male nurses;

West Norfolk and King's Lynn General Hospital be approved as a complete training school for nurses;

Warrington Isolation Hospital be approved as a complete training school for Fever nurses;

The provisional approval of Malmesbury and District Hospital, in affiliation with Royal United Hospital, Bath, be continued for a further period of one year;

The scheme of affiliation between the North Wales Sanatorium, Denbigh, and St. Helen's Hospital, Lancs., be continued for a further period of one year;

The scheme of affiliation between the Royal London Ophthalmic Hospital and St. Mary's Hospital, London, be approved:

The scheme of affiliation between the Woking and District Victoria Hospital and the Croydon General Hospital, in place of the East Surrey Hospital, Redhill, which scheme has been cancelled, be provisionally approved for a period of one year, but without prejudice to the position and rights of nurses admitted thereto under the previous scheme;

The scheme of affiliation between the Cheshire Joint Sanatorium and the London Road Hospital, Newcastle, Staffs, and the General Hospital, Birkenhead, be provisionally approved for a period of one year:

As from March 31st, 1936, the Affiliation Scheme between the Cheshire Joint Sanatorium and the Warneford General Hospital, Leamington Spa, be cancelled, but without prejudice to the position and rights of nurses already admitted thereto under the scheme;

The Royal Infirmary, Inverness, be temporarily approved as a complete training school for nurses, for the purpose of the application of a nurse trained at that hospital approved by the General Nursing Council for Scotland, who is now resident in England, and seeks permission to sit for the Final Examination held by the General Nursing Council for England and Wales.

It was agreed that Miss Ivy Isabel Clieve, S.R.N., R.S.C.N., Matron, Royal Liverpool Children's Hospital, be appointed a member of the Board of Examiners for the Supplementary Part of the Register for Sick Children's Nurses, in place of Miss M. I. Lindars, deceased.

#### Disciplinary and Penal Cases.

It was reported that the Council's Solicitor had been instructed to take the necessary action under Section 8 (1) of the Nurses' Registration Act, 1919, against three persons who have falsely represented themselves to be State Registered Nurses. This action was approved by the Council.

#### General Purposes.

On the recommendation of the General Purposes Committee, it was agreed that all Answer Books be destroyed after the publication of the results of the examinations.

#### Next Meeting of the Council.

The date of the next meeting was fixed for Friday, October 25th.

#### Disciplinary Case.

The Solicitor to the Council placed before the meeting the case of Miss Winifred Annie Thompson, S.R.N., 64091, late Sister at the North Middlesex Hospital, Silver Street, Edmonton. Miss Thompson had returned to the General Nursing Council her Certificate of Registration and Badge, and had requested that her resignation be accepted as a State Registered Nurse.

The Council considered this case *in camera* and passed the following Resolution:—

#### Resolution.

"That the Council do now judge Miss Winifred Annie Thompson, S.R.N., 64091, to have been guilty of misconduct, and do direct the Registrar to remove from the Register of Nurses the name of Miss Winifred Annie Thompson, S.R.N., 64091."

### GENERAL NURSING COUNCIL FOR SCOTLAND.

Sir John Lorne MacLeod, G.B.E., LL.D., Chairman of the Council, occupied the Chair and 11 Members of the Council were present at the meeting of the General Nursing Council for Scotland, held at 18, Melville Street, Edinburgh, on 27th September.

The Report of the Education and Examination Committee was submitted by Col. D. J. Mackintosh, C.B., M.V.O., the Convener of the Committee and was approved. In accordance with the recommendations of the Committee, the resignation of Miss Clark, King's Cross Hospital, Dundee, from the Council's Panel of Examiners was accepted and the Council resolved to minute their appreciation of her services during the long period that she had acted as an Examiner.

A reciprocal agreement with the Hong Kong Nurses' Board was agreed to under which Nurses resident in Scotland whose names are on the Register of the Hong Kong Nurses' Board and who are recommended by that Board will be registered by the Council on the understanding that the Nurses registered by the Council on the General Part of the Register will be accepted for registration by the Hong Kong Nurses' Board.

Various arrangements were approved in regard to the Examinations this month including arrangements for the Examinations being visited by Members of the Council.

#### A NURSES' LEAGUE ANNUAL MEETING.

As we go to press we receive news of the Annual Meeting of the Liverpool Royal Infirmary Training School Nurses' League, to be held on Saturday, October 19th.

A service will be held in the Chapel at 3 p.m., when the Address will be given by the Right Rev. Herbert Gresford Jones, D.D., Bishop of Warrington, which will be followed by a short General Meeting in the Lecture Theatre. Tea will be served in the Nurses' Home at 4 p.m.
