TOYS TO AID SCIENCE-UNIQUE MUSEUM FOR LONDON.

Dolls and toys of children of all the world's races are being collected by the Institute of Medical Psychology, Malet Place, London, W.C., to aid doctors and students in the anthropological and sociological branches of their

work. "The toys of a nation's children, particularly those of a primitive people, are of great value to the psychologist development," one in tracing the early phases of social development," one of the Institute's specialists explains.
