#### The Abiding Presence.

During the sessions the addresses included subjects of vital interest to those nurses entering upon their missions in foreign lands. The Devotional Address on the "Secret of Power," given by Miss E. At the Evening Session at which Miss MacManus, O.B.E., presided and delivered an address, included "Messages from Recruits," and a most interesting address on "Builders of the Indian Church" by Miss H. W. Sutherland (St. Bartholomew's Hospital) of Chingleput, S. India.

The closing Devotional Address "Our Sufficiency is in God," given by the Rev. A. H. Williamson, B.D., inspired a sense of hope, after which the meeting closed with Prayers and Benediction.
