The Monthly Meeting of the Council of the British College of Nurses was held at 39, Portland Place, London, W.1, on Saturday, April 23rd, 1938, at 2.30 p.m.

The President, Mrs. Bedford Fenwick, was in the chair, and there were present Miss M. S. Cochrane, R.R.C., Vice-president, Miss A. M. Bushby, Miss I. Macdonald, Miss D. G. Tilby, Miss S. H. Vian, Fellows; and Miss C. E. Nelson and Miss D. de M. Warren, Members.

Prayers having been read, the Minutes of the last Meeting were confirmed.

A letter was considered from a member engaged in District Nursing in which she complained that having made certain complaints concerning conditions of service—upon being

given leave to nurse her mother, one week later received a letter from the secretary asking her to resign. That she had written in reply, asking for an interview with the committee, which was refused. With consent of the nurse, a letter had been sent to the secretary stating that from the correspondence, it would appear that the nurse received notice of the termination of her engagement during absence without giving her the opportunity of stating her case, and expressing the opinion that no member of the nursing staff should be dismissed by the committee without giving her an opportunity of explanation and defence, and requesting that such an opportunity should be arranged. This had been granted, and the matter satisfactorily arranged.
