APPLICATIONS FOR AFFILIATION.

Applications for affiliation to the National Council of Nurses were considered from the Radcliffe Guild of Nurses, the Radcliffe Infirmary, Oxford, and from King's College Hospital Nurses' League.

It was proposed by Miss H. Dey, seconded by Miss M. F. Hughes and agreed that the application from the Radcliffe

Guild of Nurses be accepted.

The application from King's College Hospital Nurses' League was considered and it was agreed to notify the League that attention be drawn to the inclusion of Associates who were not necessarily graduates of schools of nursing, which standard was compulsory for admission to the National Council of Nurses of Great Britain.

Consideration of the application from King's College

Hospital Nurses' League was deferred.

THE FLORENCE NIGHTINGALE SCHOLARSHIP.

It was reported at the last Meeting of the Executive Committee, held on May 4th, 1938, that from gifts received for the purpose of awarding a Florence Nightingale Scholarship, there was a surplus of £91 1s. 9d.

The Committee decided to make an appeal to Member Organisations and award a Scholarship for 1938-1939 if

funds were forthcoming.

In March the Treasurer had invited the opinion of Presidents of Member Organisations inviting their wishes as to the gift of a Scholarship this year. In response to her letter, several Associations stated they were not prepared to contribute this year.

Ultimately £199 0s. 3d. was received; it was therefore agreed to supplement this amount with funds in hand and grant a complete Scholarship of £250, leaving in hand

£38 3s. 2d.

A somewhat limited number of candidates applied for the Scholarship, and at a meeting of the Florence Nightingale Selection Committee, held on July 12th, Miss Mildred Ellerker—trained at the Bradford Royal Infirmary, holding the position of Assistant Home Sister there, who is also a Registered Fever Nurse, a Certified Midwife, and holds a Housekeeping Certificate, who was highly recommended by Miss A. E. Merry, President of the Bradford Royal Infirmary Nurses' League—was selected, and her credentials presented to the National Florence Nightingale Memorial Committee of Great Britain.
