at the instigation of the Chairman, proposed by Miss Dey, seconded by Miss Cochrane, and agreed that a special vote of thanks be conveyed to Miss Dorothy Dixon, Hon. Secretary of the League, for all the trouble taken in reorganising details of the Constitution to make it eligible for affiliation with the National Council of Nurses.

THE ABERDEEN ROYAL INFIRMARY NURSES' LEAGUE.

It was agreed that the Aberdeen Royal Infirmary Nurses' League be admitted for affiliation if a satisfactory explanation were received concerning the meaning of Hon. Members in the Constitution of the League.

NORTH STAFFORDSHIRE ROYAL INFIRMARY NURSES' LEAGUE.

The Chairman reported that correspondence had been entered into with the North Staffordshire Royal Infirmary Nurses' League concerning affiliation, but no formal application had been received in time for this meeting.

APPOINTMENT OF SUB-COMMITTEE TO CONSIDER THE CONSTITUTION OF THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF NURSES OF GREAT BRITAIN.

The Chairman reminded those present that the Grand Council had agreed in November last that a special Sub-Committee composed of the three *ex officio* Hon. Officers, together with not more than nine members, be appointed to consider the Constitution of the National Council of Nurses as a whole, and to make recommendations to the Executive Committee.

In addition to the three ex officio Hon. Officers: Mrs. Bedford Fenwick, President; Miss M. Breay, Hon. Treasurer; and Miss S. A. Villiers, Hon. Secretary, the following ladies were appointed to act: Miss B. Monk, C.B.E., R.R.C.; Miss M. S. Cochrane, R.R.C.; Miss G. V. Hillyers, Miss Isabel Macdonald, Miss H. McLoughlin, Miss E. Brodie, Miss M. M. Ingman, Miss R. Darbyshire, R.R.C., and Miss A. M. Bushby.

D.N., and Miss M. G. Allbutt who were nominated to serve
on the Committee were unable to accept.

It was agreed that the Sub-Committee be called at an early date.

APPOINTMENT OF DELEGATES ON THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT, FLORENCE NIGHTINGALE INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION.

It was agreed that Dame Ellen Musson and Miss M. S. Cochrane be re-appointed to represent the National Council of Nurses on the Committee of Management of the Florence Nightingale International Foundation, upon their consenting to undertake the work for a further period. Both ladies accepted office.

FLORENCE NIGHTINGALE SCHOLARSHIP, 1939-1940.

The award of a Florence Nightingale Scholarship for 1939-1940 was considered.

The Chairman said that there was a balance in hand of ± 33 , and if it were decided to award a Scholarship this year, a further ± 217 would have to be subscribed.

After discussion, it was proposed by Miss H. Dey, seconded by Miss M. S. Cochrane, and agreed, that no Florence Nightingale Scholarship be awarded this year, but that if affiliated Associations had arranged to make any collection for this purpose amongst their members, they be invited to forward these donations to be kept for a future award.

NATIONAL COUNCIL OF WOMEN OF GREAT BRITAIN.

The Chairman reported the notification of the Representative Council Meeting of the National Council of Women of Great Britain to take place at Cheltenham, 9th-12th October, 1939; also correspondence concerning the

"Status of Women," which members were invited to study if they so wished.
