THE GENERAL NURSING COUNCIL FOR ENGLAND AND WALES.

SCHEME FOR THE TRAINING AND EXAMINATION OF NURSES IN THE EVENT OF NATIONAL EMERGENCY.

I.—TRAINING.

London.—The following arrangement will apply in the case of the Hospitals in the ten London Sectors, viz.:—

That in each Sector of the London area all the Hospitals—General Hospitals, Children's Hospitals, Fever Hospitals, Mental and Mental Defective Hospitals—will be considered as one Hospital in each category for the purposes of the training of nurses.

Provinces.—The following arrangement will apply in the case of Hospitals in any industrial area where decentralisation of Hospitals is ordered, viz.:—

That in each region serving a decentralised area all the Hospitals—General Hospitals, Children's Hospitals, Fever Hospitals, Mental and Mental Defective Hospitals—will be considered as one Hospital in each category for the purposes of the training of nurses.

NOTES.

- (i) Where possible, Sister Tutors should be evacuated with the trainees from vulnerable areas.
- (ii) The time spent by trainees at the casualty clearing stations should be strictly limited.
- (iii) Arrangements should be made as far as possible to ensure that each nurse obtains the requisite experience in the various branches, if necessary by transfer from one Hospital to another.

II.—EXAMINATIONS.

(1) Written Examinations and Marking of Papers.

The Written Examinations will be held in each Hospital where there are candidates and the answers despatched by the Presiding Examiners direct to the Examiners marking the answer books in the Sector or Region. The Examiners' results to be made in duplicate, one set sent to Headquarters and the other set to be kept in a safe place.
