REES CARYS ENID ...

(1) That proviso (i) to rule 2 of the rules framed by the Board under section 7 (1) of the Midwives Act, 1936, places on the local supervising authority the duty and power of determining the date between January 1st, 1939, and January 1st, 1946, on which any midwife who was enrolled prior to the former date and who is subject to the rules, shall attend her first course of instruction under the rules.

(2) That the Board hopes that each local supervising authority in the exercise of this power will arrange for approximately the same number of midwives from its area to attend courses during each year of the first seven-year

period.

(3) That, subject to any appeal under Rule 7, a midwife who fails to comply with the decision of her local supervising authority made under proviso (i) of Rule 2 will render herself liable to be reported to the Board for a breach of its rules; but that, in this connection, the Board desires to state that it has assumed that the local supervising authorities will take steps to avoid hardships being occasioned to any midwife by the exercise of the power in question.

The Secretary reported that he had placed on the Roll the names of 20 women holding the Certificate of the Central Midwives Board for Scotland or the Central Mid-

wives Board, Eire.

The Secretary reported that since the last meeting of the Board he had removed the names of 66 midwives from the Roll under section 5 (7) of the Midwives Act, 1936. (Total number of midwives so removed—1,741.)
