Miss Jones saw service during the last war, and in Palestine in 1937, when she was mentioned in Despatches.

Miss Boyd-Rochfort has been associated with St. Dunstan's for the past 21 years, first as a V.A.D., afterwards as an Assistant Matron and then Matron. In all these capacities her services were voluntary.

Possessed of a natural tenderness and sympathy towards the injured and an inexhaustible faculty for understanding, she has always been a striking personality, and these qualities she has devoted in full measure to the blinded men of St. Dunstan's. Every man knows her and loves her.
