Editorial.

THE LONDON HOSPITAL.

WE hear, with the most sincere regret, that Mr. NIXON, the House Governor of the London Hospital, has been compelled, by ill-health, to resign the post which he has held for so long, with such honour to himself and such advantage to the Institution. "For 44 years," he told the Select Committee of the House of Lords in 1890, "I have been in the service of the Hospital," and it is generally admitted elsewhere that Mr. NIXON is not only the *doyen* of Hospital managers, but the most universally honoured member of that *corps d'élite*. It is a common remark in Institutional circles, that when Mr. NIXON *was* the London Hospital its reputation never stood higher with the public, and that, from the day when his authority was superseded, its reputation has steadily declined. Whether this is strictly accurate or not, the saying certainly embodies a very general belief amongst those
