The house, which adjoins the Bath Establishment (though actually quite separate), is remarkably quiet, exquisitely clean, bright, airy, elegantly furnished, well appointed throughout, and in every respect suitable for patients of position and means. The terms are inclusive and moderate. In addition to the above, Mrs. Maitland-King has also her own system of Electro-Eucalyptus Baths, to which she invites the attention of medical men. Pine Baths as used at Homburg, combined with Electricity, can be had if desired. Local Hot Medicated Baths, Douches and Galvanism for Stiff Joints, Sprains, and Gout, and Needle Spray Tonic Baths are provided. Skilled Masseuses and Masseurs, resident or by the hour, are supplied at from two to three guineas a week. Mercurial, Acid, Alkaline, Gelatine, Bran, Starch, and all the Emolient Baths for the skin (Sulphur ones excepted) can be obtained. Mrs. Maitland-King has secured the recommendation of a number of well-known medical men, which should be a

sufficient voucher as to the excellent manner in which the institution is conducted.
