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patient can be relieved of a tooth without bleeding or prostration following the operation. This is arrived at by an electric battery, of which the patient grasps the positive electrode in the right hand, and the negative in the left, a current is passed through, gently increasing for a few seconds, during which the tooth is painlessly withdrawn. The inventor holds many testimonials as to its efficiency.


