

HOVIS BREAD AND GERM FLOUR.

Considerable credit is due to the maker of this bread. It is very palatable, easily digested, and when cut retains the moisture for a considerable time. It contains all the nutriment of brown bread amplified, and for children as adults, if taken at least at one meal a day, it will be found beneficial. Germ Flour (which forms part of this bread), can advantageously be used in place of the ordinary flour for all cookery purposes. We hear that agents are being appointed all over the country, but those who reside in or near Southsea will be able to obtain it from Mr. T. J. Heathcote, the sole agent for this district.

HOUSE FLANNELS.

Our attention has been drawn to this very useful household article. Though many flannels of their kind are used for scrubbing, it has never been our pleasure to handle one so substantially woven, soft, pliable, and absorbent, as those sold at 2/6 a dozen by Mr. Wm. Moore. They are of a good medium size, measuring 19 by 19 inches, but should a smaller size be preferred, the 15 by 15 (at 1/6 a

dozen) are very good, though not so heavy in make. A sample dozen will be sent to anyone writing for them at the rates given above.
