THE GENERAL NURSING COUNCIL FOR ENGLAND AND WALES.

A Meeting of the General Nursing Council for England and Wales was held at the offices of the Council, 23, Portland Place, London, W., on January 23rd. In the absence of Dame Ellen Musson, Miss D. M. Smith presided.

Election of Chairman.

Lady Limerick, a representative of the Privy Council, took the Chair for the election of Chairman for the ensuing year. There was only one nomination, that of Dame Ellen Musson, nominated by 13 members of Council, and she was unanimously re-elected, and it was agreed that a message of appreciation be forwarded to her for all the work she has done in the past.

Election of Vice-Chairman.

There was only one nomination for Vice-Chairman, that of Miss D. M. Smith, nominated by 11 members of Council; she was unanimously re-elected Vice-Chairman for the

ensuing year; Lady Limerick thanked her on behalf of the Council for her public-spirited action in accepting office during this trying period.

Miss D. M. Smith again took the Chair, and offered congratulations to Lady Limerick for the recent honour conferred upon her; and it was agreed that congratulations be also forwarded to Miss A. Burgess, member of Council, and Miss R. Darbyshire, previous member of Council, for honours recently bestowed upon them.

Finance.

On the recommendation of the Finance Committee, bills and claims submitted for payment were approved, and the sums of £870 for weekly salaries, £300 for postage and £60 for insurance stamps were allowed.

It was reported that notice has been received that His Majesty's Treasury has acquired the Government of India 3 per cent. Stock, 1948. The Council's holding of this Stock amounts to £4,877 11s. 3d. Instructions have been given for the re-investment of the proceeds of the sale of
