The First Examination took place on May 16th, 1945.

QUESTIONS.

- (1) Describe the supports of the uterus. What injuries may occur to these supporting tissues during labour, and what may be the effect of these injuries?
- (2) What is the purpose of ante-natal care? What advice and help can be given to an ante-natal patient to promote and maintain her health?
- (3) How would you conduct a breech delivery in a multigravida? What are the particular risks to the baby?
- (4) What may be the causes of persistent hæmorrhage after the birth of the placenta? How would you differentiate between the causes of the bleeding, and what treatment would you carry out?
- (5) What are the commonest causes of death of the premature infant? Describe the nursing care during the first week of life of an infant weighing $3\frac{1}{2}$ lb. at birth.
- (6) Write a short answer on two of the following: (i) What are the symptoms and signs of pregnancy?; (ii) What are the symptoms and signs of the onset of labour?; (iii) What is the difference between a sedative drug, an analgesic drug, and a hypnotic drug? Give examples of each with the dosage, where applicable.
