

THE GENERAL NURSING COUNCIL FOR ENGLAND AND WALES.

A meeting of the General Nursing Council for England and Wales was held at the offices of the Council, 23, Portland Place, London, W., on July 27th. Miss D. M. Smith, O.B.E., S.R.N., Chairman, presided.

Business Arising Out of the Minutes.

It was reported that the Minister of Health agreed to the extension of service by one year of the Assistant Nurses' Committee. Application had been made for a period of two years.

In connection with increase of staff, the Minister of Health still required further details before agreeing to this request.

Finance.

On the recommendation of the Finance Committee, bills and claims submitted for payment were approved, and the sums of £2,000 for examiners' claims, £200 for insurance stamps, £1,050 for postage, £2,600 for weekly salaries, and £30 for petty cash were allowed.
